She was the first secretary and bookkeeper of the Jeff Davis Vocational Trade School and the O.L.H.C. school secretary for 10 years. She was a Daughter of the American Revolution and a charter member of Entre Nous Women's Club, Pink Ladies and Catholic Daughters of America. She was a life-long member of Our Lady Help of Christians Catholic Church and was a past member of the Ladies Altar Society and the Wednesday Rosary Group. "Miss Alice", as she was affectionately known, had an absolute "Joie de Vie" for life. She was a gentle and kind woman of wisdom, humor, and warmth. She cherished her faith and many friends, but was devoted to her family above all else. We shall truly miss her smiling face and the love that she gave all of us. She absolutely loved the City of Jennings and her Catholic faith. She was a loving and caring daughter to her mother, Dr. Mattie, and a supportive and nurturing mother to her five children, and a loyal and true friend to her many life-long Jennings friends.
