After retirement, Mrs. Lafleur continued to work part-time at Dupre's Electric and Plumbing for several years. Mrs. Lafleur was a member of Our Lady Help of Christians Catholic Church and served on the Parish Council for one term. She was a member of the Catholic Daughters of America and Court Mother Cabrini for over 50 years and was past Publicity Chairman, trustee, and Unit Chairman. She was also the past President of the Ladies Altar Society and a devoted member for fifty years. She also served as Unit Chairman for the Church. Mrs. Lafleur was a member of the Bereavement Committee for several years and was appointed Eucharist minister by Father Goaux and served at Mass for the homebound for 25 years. Father Bourque appointed her a Member of the Companion of Honor and she also belonged to Adille Manuel's Rosary Group for 30 years. Mrs. Lafleur participated in the Block Collection for the American Heart Association and was a volunteer for the American Cancer Society as well as the Information Center at the Gas and Oil City Park. Mrs. Lafleur led a very long,

fulfilling life and helped and loved many people. She will be truly missed by the many people who loved her and the many people whose lives she was able to touch through her dedication to God's work, her church, and the love of her community. Mrs. Lafleur is survived by one son, L.
