Paul S. Hebert Gueydan: A mass of Christian burial will be held at St. Peter's Catholic Church in Gueydan, LA on Friday, March 2, 2012 @ 1:30 PM honoring the life of Paul S. Hebert, age 79, who was called to his heavenly father February 28, 2012. Mr. Hebert will be laid to rest in the Gueydan Cemetery with Father Jason Vidrine officiating his services. Paul S. Hebert was born on August 24, 1932 to the late Whitney Hebert and the late Marie LeJeune Hebert. He served his country honorably in the United States Navy and fought courageously in the Korean War. Paul will be honored with full military rites. He and his family lived in many areas throughout the United States and worked as a senior fellow mechanical engineer. Paul S. Hebert was the only mechanical engineer to date to receive the highly distinguished "Donald Orth Award" recognizing his outstanding technical ability, leadership, and skill solving complex problems related to the safe disposal of spent nuclear fuel. His work not only made our world safer for future generations but also distinguished him as a true leader and mentor to those who followed him. He was also a member of the Mechanical Engineering Honor Society. Paul enjoyed boating, fishing, reading scientific journals, and spending time with his family. Paul leaves behind to cherish his memory two sons Michael Hebert of Cabot, AR and Karl Hebert (Maria) of Gueydan, two daughters Pauline Quinlan (Alan) of Maine and Gina Hebert of Gueydan, and his seven grandchildren Elita, Guy, Tommy, Joshua, Mallory, Steven, and Jeremy. He was also survived by his four brothers Wilsey Hebert of Gueydan, Boatner

Hebert (Leona) of Gueydan, Johnny Hebert (Florence) of Gueydan, and Dallas Hebert (Pearl) of Crowley. Paul was welcomed into heaven by his beloved family whom preceded him in death: his parents Whitney and Marie L. Hebert; his wife Betty Meaux Hebert; and one brother Andrus Hebert (Kathy); and two sisters-in-law, Maudrey Hebert and Mary Hebert.
