In the past 10 years she still is with laughter while she suffered strokes, COPD, deteriorating eye sight, dementia and in the last two months she was diagnosed with lung cancer.

We watched her overcome obstacles time and time again.

In 2007, in rehab the physical therapist said she could never live alone due to a severe stroke she was stricken with.

With the determination, daily prayer, strong faith and will power, she has she retrained the little part of her brain that wasn't damaged She Persevered, overcoming anything that life dealt to her. Her neurologist was baffled that she was walking and talking.
